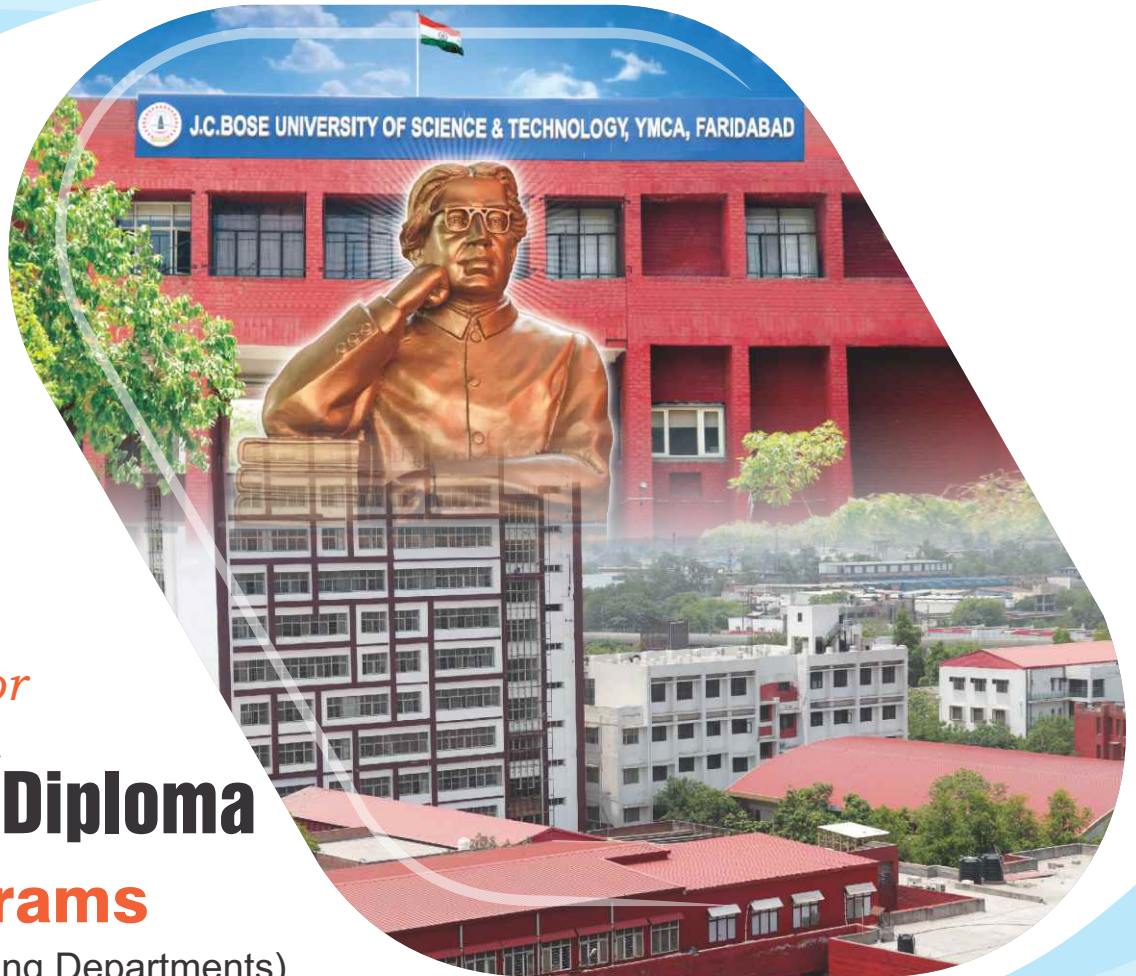

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OUR INSPIRATION

ACHARYA JAGADISH CHANDRA BOSE

(30th NOVEMBER 1858 – 23rd NOVEMBER 1937)



Shri Jagadish Chandra Bose was a pioneer scientist who investigated radio and microwave optics. He was a polymath, physicist, botanist, biologist, biophysicist and archaeologist. He made significant contributions to plant science, and laid the foundations of experimental science in India. Even a crater on the moon has been named in his honour.

He was the first person to prove that plants also have the ability to feel pain and affection. Jagdish Chandra Bose was an Indian polymath whose research has extensively contributed to the fields of Botany, Physics and Radio Science. He is credited to have laid the foundations of experimental science in India and was a pioneer in the area of microwave optics technology. He designed a galena receiver which was amongst the earlier examples of a lead sulphide photo conducting device. A polymath, Jagdish Chandra Bose left an indelible mark in several fields of study.

He invented the Crescograph for measuring the growth in plants using a series of clockwork gears. He is also credited with the invention of the first wireless detection device; an invention he never tried to get patented himself. He was made companion of the order of the Indian Empire in 1903 and Comparison of the Order of the Star of India in 1912 in recognition of his contributions to science. Jagdish Chandra was acknowledged by IEEE, USA as one of the pioneers in the discovery of radio.

Earlier, known as YMCA Institute of Engineering, Faridabad, was founded in the year 1969 as a Joint Venture of Government of Haryana and National Council of YMCAs of India with active assistance from overseas agencies of West Germany to produce highly practical oriented personnel in specialized fields of engineering to meet specific technical manpower requirement of industries.

The University is well known for its track record of employment of the pass out students since its inception. The University has been recognized at various levels by the agencies including UGC, AICTE, NAAC, NBA and NIRF. The University offers B.Tech and M.Tech programs in core and specialized engineering disciplines. 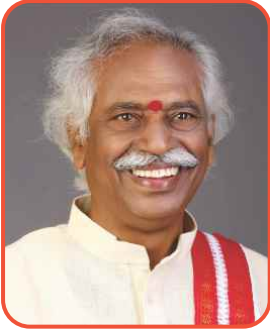

As per NEP 2020 (National Education Policy 2020) following details should be noted by all applicants:

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years and complete the degree program within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the 2nd year will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree program within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG program will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years with the minimum credit requirements.

4-year UG Degree (Honours): A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a 4-year degree program with the minimum credit requirements.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of the University/College. The research project/dissertation will be in the major discipline with the minimum credit requirements.

–The University provides 50% concession in tuition fee for studies in all courses to the regular employees of the University and their wards.

HOSTEL FACILITY



The University provides Hostel facility for Girl students of the University, which are located in University Campus separately. The Boys Hostel was demolished in September, 2022, and from that month onward, the hostel will not be available for subscription by all upcoming batches, including 2023-24 as well as 2024-25 batches. While providing an opportunity of campus living, hostel look forward to residents to shoulder and maintain the best traditions of the University as a whole. There are five wings in Girls Hostel: 1. Kasturba Hall, 2. Sarojini Hall, 3. Mother Teresa Hall, 4. Kalpana Chawla Hall. There are dedicated staff members who cater to the needs of the hostellers 24x7. The staff includes a Resident Attendant, Guards, Sweepers and Data Entry Operator. Strict rules have been formulated to maintain discipline and hygiene in the hostel premises though prohibition of ragging is the major concern of the authorities. The hostel is equipped with major facilities such as Reading room with newspapers and magazines, common rooms with LED TVs, high speed Wi-Fi, Water coolers fitted with RO, CCTV cameras and security guards. The hostel is provided with indoor and outdoor games for recreation & entertainment of the residents within hostel premises. Visitor room is available at the entry of girls' hostel for the relatives of the students to meet them. Guest room is also available in girls' hostel for female relatives of students. Girls' Hostel will be allotted on first come first basis.

A. LALITHA BHAWAN

The newly constructed Girls' Hostel wing – A. Lalitha Bhawan, named in honour of India's first women engineer – A. Lalitha, is an addition to our exceptional accommodation for female students which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chancellor – Governor Haryana Shri Bandaru Duttatraya on July 17, 2023. The hostel offers a total of 84 well-appointed rooms, ensuring a comfortable and conducive living environment for up to 242 students. The hostel features spacious common areas (one on each floor) where students can study, socialize, and relax. These communal spaces serve as vibrant hubs of activity, facilitating interactions and connections among residents. With dedicated sick room prompt medical assistance is readily available whenever needed. Administratively, the hostel is equipped with the necessary facilities to ensure efficient management and supervision. From warden suites to storage rooms, every aspect of the hostel is thoughtfully designed to meet the needs of its residents and support their academic and personal growth.

MESS FACILITY

The hostel mess which is run on contract basis provides hygienic food and water with clean utensils and proper furniture for the hostellers to dine. Police verification and medical check-up of the mess workers is done to ensure the safety and health of the students. Periodic inspection is done by the Wardens and Students' Representatives to maintain the standards and quality of the food items. Facility of shift canteen is also provided to the hostellers at the time of exams.

MESS/HOSTEL RULES:

1. The University Girls' hostel mess is run on contract basis and is supervised by the mess committees. The Convener of the mess committee and its members are nominated from the residents of hostel for a fixed period by the wardens and the mess committees should ordinarily be changed after every two/three months.
2. Ragging in any form in the university/ hostel/mess is illegal and banned as per UGC Regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Institutions, 2009 act of Govt. of India. In case of disciplinary action against a student, physical presence/Undertaking of Parents (only) will be valid. Uncles, brothers/sisters/cousins will not be entertained.

3. All the residents are expected to take their meals in the hostel mess.
4. All the residents must carry their hostel I-card to the mess while taking meal, failing which they are first warned and then fined according to hostel rules.
5. Meals will be served only in the dining hall during the hours notified. However, in case of illness, meals can be served in the room on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of the University.
6. Residents are not allowed to go into the cooking area.
7. Cooking in the rooms is strictly prohibited.
8. No resident shall take meals from the mess to which she does not belong. A member is not permitted to take food in place of another member.
9. The timing of meals will ordinary be:

10. Under no circumstances, members are allowed to take cups, saucers, tumblers and other utensils of the hostel mess to their rooms/lawns outside.
11. Students are expected to maintain perfect discipline and order in the dining halls during dining hours. They are not allowed to enter the kitchen and help themselves. If extra food is required, they must ask the concerned person serving extras. All diners are expected to wear decent dresses in the dining halls.
12. Residents of the hostels have to pay the monthly mess bills upto 12th of every month failing which the fine of Rs.10/- per day will be charged. No rebate will be given to the defaulters.
13. Students are not allowed in the mess to take meals in shorts or exposed legs.
14. The residents of the hostel have to submit the hostel and mess charges in form of Demand Draft in CHW office at the start of the session.
15. "No Dues Certificate" will be issued from the hostel only to those students who have cleared all the dues to the hostel. The Chief Warden will report to the Registrar the names of the defaulters of the hostel dues for further action.
16. Every student who is residing in Girls' Hostel is required to pay mess bill of minimum 25 days.
17. After examination before leaving the hostel, the residents should submit the photocopy of "No Dues Slip" signed by hostel attendant & hostel I-card to their respective warden. The slip is checked before allotting the hostel in next session.
18. The procedure for taking permission to take part in extra-curricular activities is as follows:-
 - i. The students should submit request application to Hostel Warden. Application must be signed by concerned Authority (Chairperson or DSW).
 - ii. The Warden of respective hostel clearly writes either it is recommended or not recommended.
 - iii. The ACHW (Girls) will send application to the Proctor/Chief Warden of the University for the Proper Security of the participating students.
 - iv. After the allowed time, the respective warden will ensure that either all the students have returned to the hostel or not?
 - v. In case of any problem, the Warden may contact ACHW (Girls)/Chief Warden/ Proctor.

NON-PAYMENT OF CHARGES & FEE

The students will be given 20 days time from date of issuance of notice to deposit the fee without fine and further 15 days time to deposit the fee with a late fee fine of Rs.500/-. The students seeking extension in timelines as a special case are required to submit such request before last date to deposit the fee with fine. However, an increment of Rs.500/- in addition to last applicable fine will be done for every 15 days in case of students seeking extension in fee deposit timelines keeping in view duration of extension sought. Otherwise, the name of the student shall be struck-off from the University rolls if he/she fails to deposit the fee within the notified timelines.

Such a student whose name stands struck-off from the University may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Vice-Chancellor, on payment of all arrears due from him/her along with fine applicable at the time of submission of re-admission request i.e. an increment of Rs.500/- for every 15 days from the last date to deposit the fee with fine and re-admission fee of Rs.5000/-. Re-admission is allowed before start of examination only. Students whose name stands struck-off from University rolls shall not be allowed to appear for end semester examinations.

Re-admission is also permitted in the same semester in the next academic session on payment of current semester fee & previous due semester fee only with a lump sum fine of Rs.2500/- and re-admission fee of Rs.5000/-. If the last date to deposit the fee falls on a holiday, next working day shall be treated as the last date to deposit the fee. Further, to avoid any hardship to students who are availing study loan facility from bank, they will be allowed to submit the fees as and when bank releases the same.

Any student who is detained due to a shortage of attendance/ or any other reason must apply to join classes 15 days before the start of session, failing which no application to join classes will be entertained.

The amount of security deposited by the students is refundable after their passing or leaving the course from the University. In case any student fails to deposit "No Dues Certificate" within a period of one and a half year from date of leaving/declaration of his/her result, his/her security would stand forfeited.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION & REFUND OF FEE

- The Application Fees deposited by the candidate for online application is non-refundable.
- For all B.Tech programs guidelines of HSTES (admission brochure) /AICTE Approval Process Handbook and AICTE Academic Calendar 2024-25 will be followed. The refund will be processed as per the instructions of HSTES.
- For Refund of all other programs (except B.Tech), guidelines will be notified on the University Website separately.
- Candidate must submit his/her application for withdrawal of Admission / Refund of Fees, by hand in the prescribed format Annexure-XVII, (as mentioned in this Information Brochure) along with necessary documents in Academic Branch.

SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS

SC AND BC POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP

In the scheme of Technical Education Department for students of B. Tech & M. Tech Courses and Scheme of Higher Education Department for students of other courses (BA, BSW, MA, B. Sc, M. Sc. B. Com, BBA, MBA, BCA, MCA), benefits are available to SC and BC students whose parents/guardians income from all sources does not exceed Rs.2.50 Lacs per annum. In this scheme tuition fee & other allowances are reimbursable subject to attainment of 75% attendance in each semester and as per instructions issued by state Govt (Haryana) from time to time.

Application Forms for this scholarship are filled in the month of November/December every year online or offline mode as per notice published on the University website or by welfare of Schedule Caste and Backward Classes Department, Chandigarh.

MERIT-CUM-MEANS SCHOLARSHIP

For Grant of Merit-cum-Means Scholarship for B.Tech./MCA/MBA students. 15% of the sanctioned strength of B.Tech./MCA/MBA courses are eligible for grant of Merit-cum-Means Scholarship for B.Tech./MCA/MBA students @ Rs.750/- p.m. The criteria of parent's income will be as per State Govt. Norms all above scholarships.

Performance and attendance standards shall be as per University Rules or decided by Competent Authority from time to time. (The above Scholarships are for candidates belonging to Haryana or Admitted through Central Counseling only).

FEE ASSISTANCE TO ECONOMICALLY WEAK/NEEDY STUDENTS

The University in association with The MOB (Alumni Association of JC Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad) supports the economically weak/needy students of the University by paying their fee in the form of soft loan from the session 2020-21. Under this scheme, financial support in the form of soft loan are provided to the following students:-

- Death of a parent/sole earning member of the family.
- Critical illness for self/family member incurring exorbitant cost.
- Loss of job/earning of a parent/sole earning member for a substantial period.
- Any other reason to the satisfaction of the Competent Authority.

The notice for this scholarship is issued in every semester.

VISHWA PRAKASH MISSION

Vishwa Prakash Mission, Faridabad is supporting students by offering scholarship (Merit-Cum-Means) since 2016-17. Notification of scholarship is issued in the month of October-November every year.

2 ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTION (EWS)

Beside the above reservation, the person belonging to Economically Weaker Section (EWS) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) shall get 10% reservation in admissions. These seats shall be supernumerary in nature. Candidates have to apply separately for EWS scheme. The candidates belonging to EWS category have to submit a certificate as per the Annexure-XIV of the Information Brochure. The issuing authority shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.

3 EX-SERVICEMEN & FREEDOM FIGHTER

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilized due to non-availability of suitable category of handicapped candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). Further 3% horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen / Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/ Institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year-wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in the academic year 2020, the next block i.e. Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2021 and so on.

4 SCHEDULED CASTE

Instructions issued vide Notification No.22/27/2019-1GS-III dated 04.06.2020 by the GS-III Branch of Govt. of Haryana for Haryana Scheduled Castes should be implemented as follow:

“Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as numerated in its Annexure.

Where a seat is set aside for candidate from the deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institution is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of the deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualification, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Scheduled Castes.” (List of Scheduled Castes and Deprived Scheduled Castes are given in Annexure-XV).

5 BACKWARD CLASS

Backward Class certificate (BCA or BCB) as per Annexure-V, if applicable and creamy layer / annual parental income certificate as per No. 491-SW (1)-2021 dated 17 November, 2021. Refer the notification available Annexure-XVIII.

6 RESERVATION TO FEMALE CANDIDATE

25 % horizontal reservation in all categories shall be provided for female candidates.

7 ONE SUPERNUMERARY SEAT FOR SINGLE GIRL CHILD

The University has taken a decision regarding creation of one supernumerary seat in UGC approved course/ programmes (except AICTE approved programmes viz B.Tech/ BBA/ M.Tech/ MBA/MCA) being run in the University Teaching Departments, for a single girl child of her parents. The admission on this Supernumerary seat in a UGC course will be made on the basis of the merit of entrance test conducted by University or marks of qualifying examination as the case may be as per schedule mentioned in the University prospectus. The eligible single girl child claiming for the Supernumerary seat in a UGC course is required to submit an Affidavit on Stamp Paper worth Rs.20/- duly attested by 1st Class Magistrate, to be obtained from the parents of the girl child declaring therein that the girl child is only a single child of their family and not having any brother/sister. If the supernumerary seat in a course remains vacant due to non availability of suitable candidate, it may not be offered to candidate of any other category. The Supernumerary seat shall be offered to only single girl child of Haryana State, provided she is otherwise eligible from all angles.

If there is more than one claimant to the seat under this category, the admission will be made as per the merit list of entrance test or marks of the qualifying examination, as the case may be.

8 TUITION FEE WAIVER (TFW) SCHEME

Tuition Fee Waiver scheme (TFW) Scheme shall be applicable to B.Tech, MCA, MBA etc. (as applicable) Programs as per the AICTE guidelines given in the latest Approval Process Handbook of AICTE. Under this scheme up to a maximum of 5% seats of approved Intake are available in AICTE approved B. Tech, MCA & MBA programs of the University. Sons/Daughters of parents whose annual income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 8,00,000/- can apply to take admission under this scheme. All other Fees except Tuition Fee shall have to be paid by the beneficiary. A letter in this respect shall be issued by the Competent Authority for admission to each beneficiary student admitted under this scheme and he/ she shall not be allowed to change the Institution/ program under any circumstances. In the event of non-availability of students in this category, the same shall not be given to any other category of candidates. Candidates have to apply separately for TFW scheme.

9 HARYANA GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TOPPERS (HGST)

One seat in each branch discipline of B.Tech courses is reserved for topper of 10+2 within sanctioned intake (Science stream of year 2024 having minimum 2nd Division).

10 SUPPORT TO ABANDONED, SURRENDERED AND ORPHAN CHILDREN

One seat in all UG/PG/ other programs of UTD of this University will be reserved for Abandoned / Surrendered / Orphan Children. The programmes which required AICTE Approval, the seat will be filled under EWS Category and if same is lying vacant or no application has been received, then seat will be merged in EWS Category. For other programmes except AICTE approval, one seat reserved as supernumerary seat and if remain vacant will not be filled/merged in any other category, as per the provisions of HSTES.

Criteria for admission under this policy:-

- a) Abandoned and Surrendered Children upto the age of 25 years who were admitted to the Child Care Institutions before the age of 05 year (as Abandoned) and before the age of 01 year (as Surrendered) and have completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institution.
- b) Orphan Children, who have lost their parents (both father & mother) and is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian or whose legal guardian is not willing to take or capable of taking care of the child and having the family income (including guardian, if any) less than Rs. 2.00 Lakh Per Annum from all sources.

Both (a) and (b) will be provided Free Higher Education including Technical Education alongwith hostel facilities in the University. However, minimum eligibility criteria of respective courses as per University Information Brochure notified time to time, must be fulfilled by the applicants (**see the Annexure XX for detailed information**).

Important Instructions for Reserved Category Seats

- The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the State Govt. and is subject to any change/ amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
- All eligible candidates of reserved categories of Haryana shall be considered first for Haryana General Category seats.
- Haryana Resident certificate should be in format as per Annexure-II.
- Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a University/ College/ School situated within the State of Haryana, will be deemed to be Haryana Residents and will not be required to submit certificate of Bonafide Resident of Haryana.
- Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste category are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-IV.
- Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B') candidates have to submit the certificate prescribed as per Annexure-V & Income certificate issued by the authority prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004. The BC candidates (Block 'A' & 'B') for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish an affidavit / undertaking to the effect he/she is not covered under the criteria of creamy layer as per Annexure VI as well as Annexure XVIII of the Information Brochure. The said Affidavit / Undertaking shall be furnished both by the father and mother of the candidate.
- Only those candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission under "Differently-abled persons" category Certificate must be obtained from the Chief Medical Officer heading the constituted Medical Board of the concerned District. "Differently-abled" candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure -VII.
- Children & grand-children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana who wish to be considered for reservation shall be required to produce certificate as per Annexure-VIII.
- If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he/ she belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time it is discovered that his/ her claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution and all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The University may take such other action against the student and his / her parents/ guardians, as it may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
- In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilized due to non-availability of suitable category of handicapped candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Otherwise his / her admission will stand cancelled automatically and the entire fee submitted at the time of admission will be forfeited. If the candidate wants to apply for more than one department/course, he/ she should fill the form separately through online portal after paying the required application fee.
7. **No claim of change in merit list of the candidate will be entertained by producing any category certificate / other certificate after the display of merit list.**

NOTE

The candidates of M.Tech. / M.Sc. / MBA / MCA / M.A. / MSW / B.Sc. / BBA / BCA / B.A. / BSW / B.Voc / D.Voc / Diploma / PGD and all other programs are required to fill online application form with the application fee through online mode on or before the last date.

2. The candidates shall be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test (provisionally) subject to determination of eligibility at a later stage. The candidates shall have no right to claim admission to any course merely due to their appearing in the University Entrance Test.
3. No column should be left blank in the Online Application Form, write N.A. against the column which is not applicable. Otherwise it will be considered as incomplete and liable to be rejected.
4. In case any candidate is found to have supplied false information/certificates/ documents etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her Application Form, he/she shall be liable to be debarred from admission to the program.
5. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled and all fee & other dues paid by his/her shall be forfeited. The University/Faculty may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
6. As per directions of the Director, Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide their letter No. 18/30-2015 UNP (4) dated 08.03.2017 link AADHAR ID with the bank account is mandatory for all the students to be admitted in the University Teaching Departments/Faculties w.e.f. the session 2017-18. Every student shall be in possession of AADHAR Number at the time of admission.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST

1. Candidates can download their Admit Cards (only for Entrance Test based courses) from the University website before the date of conduct of Entrance Test. In case, due to any reason, a candidate cannot download his/her Admit Card two days before the Entrance Test he/she must contact the Academic Branch (Email: academics@jboseust.ac.in). Such candidates must bring two recent passport size photographs duly attested by a Gazetted Officer or Head of the department/faculty last attended by him/her to obtain duplicate Admit Card, 1-2 days before the Entrance Test. No Admit Card will be issued on the day of Entrance Test.
2. Candidate must bring legibly printed Admit Card and one identify proof like Driving License, Voter Card, Aadhar Card, Passport etc./ at the Examination Centre failing which candidate will not be allowed to enter in the Examination Centre.
3. Candidates must not write or change any entry made in the Admit Card after it has been received by them.
4. Candidates must bring the Admit Card with them at the time of Entrance Test. Without Admit Card the candidates will not be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test.
5. Candidates are advised to sit only at the seat allocated to him/her by the Administrator/Centre Superintendent/Invigilator. At the start of the examination and within first five minutes, candidates are advised to ensure that they have got the correct question paper.
6. Candidates are warned not to carry mobile phone or any type of electronic or communication device. If any candidate is found possessing any such item, he/she will not be allowed to enter in the examination centre. Candidate found possessing mobile phone and any other aiding material/device as mentioned above in the examination room will be treated serious violation and it will amount to cancellation of the candidature.

ANTI RAGGING GUIDELINES & PREVENTIVE MEASURES

Govt. of India and State Govt. of Haryana have already banned the ragging of newly admitted students in all the Professional Institutions. The stern disciplinary action is taken against the students indulging in the ragging of the students, including expulsion from the University and hostels/mess or fine with a public apology or withholding of scholarships or other benefit, debarring from representation in events, withholding results, suspension of campus recruitment / industrial training and alike. If, the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, then collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent. In view of the involvement of some senior students in ragging of 1st year students in some of the Institutions in the previous year, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has directed the concerned Institutions/Universities to take immediate steps for the prevention of ragging of students. The violation of this law (ban on ragging) is not only punishable by a fine of Rs.50,000/- but also may attract rigorous imprisonment for 3 years. In order to curb the ragging, the University takes various steps such as help from the local administration for keeping vigilance in the Campus, senior students are advised individually and in groups and cooperation of their parents is sought explaining the aspects of punishment for violation of law of ban on ragging, by deputing faculty members at different places in the University premises to check the ragging & to book the defaulters during the day and also at mid night.

What constitutes ragging:

- a any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- f any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Deterrent Measures for Ragging:

- Cancellation of admission.
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding/ withdrawing of scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test examination or other evaluation process.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international event.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- Rustication for periods ranging from 1 to 4 Semesters.
- Expulsion from the university and consequent debarring from admission to any other university/institution.
- Collective punishment where warranted.
- Lodging of FIR.
- Display the names and punishment awarded to offender of ragging on the notice boards.
- Endorse the Migration/Transfer certificates with the remarks and punishment awarded to the person on account of ragging.
- Imposition of Fine of Rs. 50,000/-

ATTENDANCE RULES

1. Every student should get at least 75% attendance in aggregate at the end of each semester to be eligible to appear in end semester examinations.
2. Deficiency up to 10% can be condoned by Chairperson/concerned Dean in severe cases on compensatory ground/medical cases i.e. students with 65% or above attendance can be eligible to appear in the semester exam if 10% deficiency is condoned by Chair person/Dean.
3. The student having below 65% attendance is liable to be detained.

However, the benefit of additional 2% attendance may be given to the students for participation in Activities like; NSS, NCC, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, Swatch Bharat Abhiyan or any other community services on the recommendation of concerned Incharge / DWS.
4. Detained student will have to repeat the respective academic semester in the next academic session by paying fee/due etc. as applicable.
5. Any student, who is detained due to a shortage of attendance/ or any other reason must apply to join classes 15 days before the start of session, failing which no application to join classes will be entertained.

It is obligatory on the part of Chairpersons/Teacher concerned to announce attendance position of students before commencement of class test 1 and 2. It is emphasized that students are solely responsible for maintaining the requisite attendance as per University rules and obtaining monthly updates from their respective subject teachers. After the completion of classes, the University will not entertain any claims regarding attendance from students or their parents.

NOTE:- However, the Parents/Guardians of students are also requested to keep close watch on the attendance position of their son/daughter/ward by enquiring from the concerned Head of Department No further notice shall be issued in this regard.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Student Conduct

Students must follow the rules and regulations of J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad, Haryana such as:

- Carry the identity cards and wear it around the neck at all times especially when inside the university campus.
- Students shall exhibit highest order of decency not to deface, disfigure, damage or destroy or cause any loss in any manner to public, private or University properties.
- Possessing, consuming or distributing alcohol, smoking, tobacco, harmful drugs, narcotics, e-cigarettes and gutkas are strictly prohibited.
- Drive safely in the university campus and follow traffic rules.
- Park your vehicle in designated parking spots only.
- Do not park in or impede access to: crosswalks, fire hydrants or fire lanes.
- Do not allow/entertain visitors in the campus without prior permission.
- Maintain dignity, decorum and decency regarding wearing of dresses, gossiping, and behaviors. Respect not only the members of teaching/non-teaching members of the university but also to the fellow students.
- Observe silence and tranquility while walking down the corridors (especially when classes are going on).
- Immediately report any accidents or unsafe behaviors to University authority.
- The students are strictly prohibited from indulging and showing boisterous, disorderly and obnoxious behaviour and staging 'Dharna', taking out procession, slogan shouting, putting up poster/writing on wall and roads etc. in the campus.
- Clustering in the corridors or crowding in front of the offices or the campus roads are to be avoided.
- Students should refrain from the use of mobile phones in the class room, computer centre and other academic areas.
- Students should refrain from environmental damage activities in the university campus like throwing plastics, food items etc.
- Students are expected to exhibit highest order of self-esteem and self-respect and are prohibited from indulging in anti-institutional, anti-national, anti-social, communal, immoral or political expressions and activities within the campus.
- Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the University, with media representatives or invite media persons on to the campus without the permission of University authorities.
- Students are not permitted to either audio or video record lectures in class rooms or actions of other students, faculty, or staff without prior permission.
- Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity on the campus to media without prior permission.
- Students are expected to use the social media carefully and responsibly. They cannot post derogatory comments about other individuals from the University on the social media or indulging in any such related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the University.
- Theft or abuse of University computers and other electronic resources such as computer and electronic communications facilities, electrical gadgets, systems, and services, which includes unauthorized entry, use or tamper University or facilities, private residences of staff/teachers etc. offices, classrooms, computers networks, and other restricted facilities and interference with the work of others, is punishable offence.
- Unauthorized entry of outsiders into the campus as well in hostels is strictly prohibited. Without specific permission of the authorities, students shall not bring outsiders (even parents or family members) to the university premises.
- Verbal or non-verbal conduct such as unfair comments, remarks or jokes, letters, phone calls, SMS or emails, gestures, exhibition of pornography, indecent stares, physical contact, stalking, sounds or displays of a derogatory nature which have the purpose and/or effect of interfering with student's/staff's/faculty's academic performance/living environment will be considered as misbehaviour.
- No Society/ Association or Club shall be formed without the permission of the Vice-Chancellor/Dean Student Welfare.
- No meeting shall be convened and no person shall be invited to address any meeting in the university premises without prior permission of the Dean Student Welfare/Proctor.

VIOLATION OF DISCIPLINE OF UNIVERSITY

- Disruption of teaching, student examination, research or administrative work, curricular/extra-curricular activity or residential life of the members of the university or any act likely to cause such disruption.
- Furnishing false certificates or false information in any manner to the University.
- Damaging or defacing University property/name or the property/vehicles of members of the university or any other property inside or outside the university campus.
- Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidatory language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
- Arousing communal, caste or regional feelings or creating disharmony among students.
- Indulging in acts of physical gambling/e-gambling.
- Causing or colluding in the unauthorized entry of any person into the campus or in the unauthorized occupation of any portion of University premises, including hostels or residence block, by any person.
- Indulging in Ragging
- An assault upon, or intimidation of, or insulting behaviour towards a teacher, officer, employee or student or any other person.
- Eve teasing/inappropriate behaviour towards women/girls students
- Possession or use of any weapons such as knives, explosives and fire arms or any such material in the university premises.
- Committing forgery, tampering with or misuse of the University documents or records, identification cards, etc.
- Indulging in Smoking
- Use of Alcohol and drugs

ACT OF VIOLATION OF DISCIPLINE

The University would Impose the following penalties if any student of the University found involved in the acts of indiscipline activities:

1	All acts of violence and all forms of coercion such as gheraos, sit-in or any variation of the same which disrupt the normal academic and administrative functioning of the university and or any act which incites or leads to violence.
2	Gheraos, laying siege or staging demonstrations around the residence of any member of the University Community or any other form of coercion, intimidation or disturbance of right to privacy of the residents of the campus.
3	Consuming or possessing dangerous drugs/drink or other intoxicants in the university premises
4	Theft or Damaging or defacing, in any form, any property of the university or its student or the property/vehicle of any member of the university community
5	Hunger strikes, Dharnas, group bargaining and any other form of protest by blocking entrance or exit of the university, academic and/or administrative complexes/offices or disrupting the movements of any member of the university community
6	Furnishing false certificates, or false information in any manner to the university.
7	Committing forgery, tampering with the Identity Card or University records, impersonation, misusing University property (Movable or immovable), documents and records, tearing of pages, defacing, burning or any other material.
8	Any act of moral turpitude
9	Use of abusive, defamatory, derogatory or intimidatory language against any member of University Community

Sr. No.	Acts
10	Causing or colluding in the unauthorized entry of any person into the campus or unauthorised occupation of any portion of the University premises by any person
11	Unauthorised occupation of the hostel rooms, unauthorized acquisition and use of University furniture in one's hostel room or elsewhere and accommodating unauthorized guests or other persons in the halls of residence
12	Indulging in acts of gambling (in any form) with in the university premises
13	Disrupting/ blocking normal movement of person(s) or traffic in the premises of University blockade or forceful prevention of any normal movement of traffic, violation of security, safety rules notified by the university
14	Not disclosing one's identity when asked to do so by a faculty member or employee of the university/security personnel
15	Improper behaviour while on tour or excursion
16	Engaging in any attempt at wrongful confinement of any member of the faculty, staff, student or anyone camping inside the campus
17	Any intimidation or insulting behaviour (Physical violence/abuse/man handling) towards a student, staff or faculty member or any other person
18	Entering on a vehicle without valid sticker, pass or permission
19	Not wearing ID card around the neck while in University campus

Note:

Any other related issue not covered above will also be addressed.

PROCEDURE OF PROCTORIAL ENQUIRY

As per this document, University has a Proctorial system where administration of student related matters pertaining to all acts of indiscipline are delegated to the Proctor. He/She is assisted by deputy proctors and assistant proctors. The size of the Proctorial Board is decided by the competent authority.

Receiving and recording the Complaint:

- (A) A complaint /report received in the Office of Proctor from the Registrar office.
- (B) The complaints are also received by the Proctor office/Security Supervisor directly from students, teachers and non-teaching staff of the University.

After receipt of a complaint it is scrutinized by the Proctor and he/she will set up Proctorial Enquiry Committee of either a one/two/three member(s). Proctorial Enquiry Committee shall conduct an in-depth investigation into the matter. Proctorial enquiry is an internal enquiry of the University and hence, no other person except the committee members are allowed to be present during hearings. The accused or complainant is not allowed to be represented by a third party. Similarly, he/she cannot have an observer during the process of enquiry. The Proctorial Enquiry Committee may impose one or more of following penalties if any student of the University found indulged in above acts of indiscipline activities:

- A Warning
- B Fine up to Rs. 50000/-
- C Imposing of security deposit.
- D Suspension from class for recommended period.
- E Temporary or permanent withdrawal of concessions /aids /stipends / scholarships /fellowship/any other facility, etc.
- F Removal/debarring from placement/training by the university.
- G Permanent or temporary expulsion from hostel.
- H Forfeiture of right to admission to any course in the university/ right to employment in the university in future.
- I Rustication/Expulsion from the University.

The Proctorial Enquiry Committee will submit the final report to Proctor of the university for necessary action. However, the final decision of Vice-Chancellor will be abided to all.

INCUBATION CENTRE

In spirit of providing a supportive platform to young students to realise their start-up dreams, J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad has established J. C. Bose Technology Business Incubator (JCB-TBI) with the support of The Department of Information Technology Electronics & Communication, Haryana (DITECH) and one of our own alumni Mr. Mohit Vohra, Founder and MD, MV Electrosystems Pvt Ltd.

The University has created an ecosystem for innovation including JCB-TBI, supported by other initiatives including IoT Lab, Co-working Space, 3D printing setup for prototyping and testing, for creation and transfer of knowledge. At JCB-TBI we offer a wide range of Technical, Strategic Management and Business mentoring support by the expert faculty and experts from various industries. We regularly organize activities like seminars, start-up events, motivational and technical lectures, workshops and symposiums on Ideation, Start-up and Entrepreneurship, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and Industry-Academia Innovative practices etc. to kindle the entrepreneurial spirit of our students and participants. JCB-TBI also supports our budding entrepreneurs with fund raising assistance through various activities.

The University has set up a comprehensive Start-up Entrepreneurship Workshop Program to help our students to understand the deep nuances of business and all its components including market research, business planning, pitching to investors for successful implementation of their start-up business ideas. Incubation Centre has already successfully conducted over 50 programs /competitions / workshops for Innovation and Entrepreneurship and half a dozen programs / workshops on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) etc.



DIGITAL LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Unleashing the Learning Avenues through Indigenous Digital LMS



The university has a dedicated web-based Learning Management system named “Digital Learning Management System (DLMS)” which is in-house developed. The key objective of this practice is to host and track online learning. Providing a virtual hub where learners can access course materials, DLMS aims to make contents accessible to remote learners, support blended and flipped learning environments; and provide a central location for learning across the University.

At the student end, the system provides facilities to view the shared content, submit due assignments & tests, track their studying progress and interact with their teachers. The purpose of the practice is to combine the traditional instructor-led approach with online learning to enable learners to have control over their training. DLMS is enabled with features like facility of uploading study material and assignments, live chat, live classes, test facility, continuous assessment, discussion forums etc. and students can access it with their login. The quick links of important platforms like University's Library e-portal, National Digital Library, SWAYAM, Spoken tutorial, ZOOM, Google Classrooms and other e-platforms have also been integrated in this system.

J.C. BOSE IOT RESEARCH CENTRE

We have set up a state of the art, fully equipped Internet of Things (IoT) lab for students to discover their true potential in IoT technology to design, create, test and implement prototypes for their technology based start-up ideas. The lab has all the latest tools and machines including 3D printers, electronic workbenches, Arduino kits and raspberry pi tolls etc.

The university has collaborated with RVC Bangalore for IoT programs and projects. University is also under process to sign an MoU with Defence Services for research and development of IoT based projects.

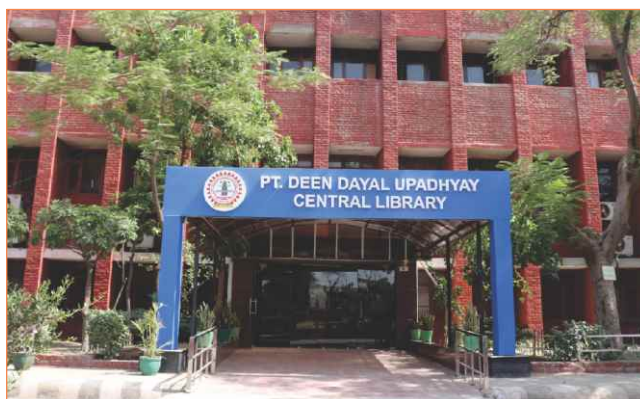


UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

The Central Library of the University has been named after the great Indian thinker and leader Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay. The Central Library of J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad is a modern library meant to fulfil the information needs of students, research scholars, faculty and staff of various departments of the University. The library is situated at ground floor having area of more than 7200 sq.ft. with air-conditioned facility. It is well equipped with modern technology like e-Library Portal, Remote Access facility, Federated Search, Artificial Intelligence based searching, Mobile App etc. The library is centrally located within easy reach from all the departments, hostels and residential areas. It has two Reading Halls with a total capacity of 200 seats.

It is fully automated with Web Based Library Management System "KOHA". Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility is available to know the availability of books and its position in the library. Library is also equipped with RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology. RFID enabled gates are available for security check of documents. Books can be returned round the clock by the users through Book Drop facility. Library is having total collection of more than 89000 books in the stream of Engineering, Technology, Sciences, Management and Humanities. More than 3300 e-journals are being subscribed from the reputed publishers e.g., Elsevier's Science Direct, Taylor & Francis, IEEE, Springer Link and Nature to promote the research activities in the University. More than 7400 titles of e-books from McGraw-Hill, Pearson Education, Elsevier, Tritech, CBS and EBSCO are accessible to the users. Library is also subscribing good number of print magazines and daily newspapers. Press Reader package is being subscribed to access thousands of national and international newspapers and magazines with access of back issues. The library is also the member of DELNET and e ShodhSindhu consortia.

e-Library Portal with remote access facility provides access to more than 6 Lakh e-resources. It provides the access of variety of e-resources e.g. e-journals, e-books, expert lectures, video tutorials, e-newspapers, e-magazines, and other e-contents. It can be accessed by the registered users 24X7 from anywhere. Mobile App is also available for both Android and iOS users to access e-Library Portal on smart phones



STUDENTS GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad is committed to provide a safe, trustworthy and harmonious work place to all its stakeholders. The University has an effective mechanism in place to deal with day to day grievances related to students, faculty and staff members. The Grievance Redressal Committee for students has been constituted in the University based on the University Grants Commission (Grievance Redressal) Regulations, 2019.

STUDENT GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEES (SGRC)

To resolve the issues related to students, SGRC may be constituted at various levels as per UGC Regulations for which Dean Student Welfare (DSW) of the University will act as Nodal Officer for the Student Grievance Redressal Committee of the University.

- **Departmental Student Grievance Redressal Committee (DSGRC)**

A complaint by an aggrieved student relating to the Department or Faculty or Centre of the University shall be addressed to the Departmental Student Grievance Redressal Committee (DSGRC) to be constituted at the level of the Department, Faculty or Centre, as the case may be.

- **Institutional Student Grievance Redressal Committee (ISGRC)**

Where a complaint does not relate to any academic Department, Faculty or Centre of the University, as the case may be, the matter shall be referred to the Institutional Student Grievance Redressal Committee (ISGRC) to be constituted by the Vice Chancellor.

- **University Student Grievance Redressal Committee (USGRC)**

The Vice Chancellor of the University shall constitute such number of University Student Grievance Redressal Committees (USGRCs), as may be required to consider grievances unresolved by one or more CSGRC or DSGRC or ISGRC and each USGRC may take up grievances arising from Colleges/Departments/Institutions, on the basis of the jurisdiction assigned to it by the Vice Chancellor.

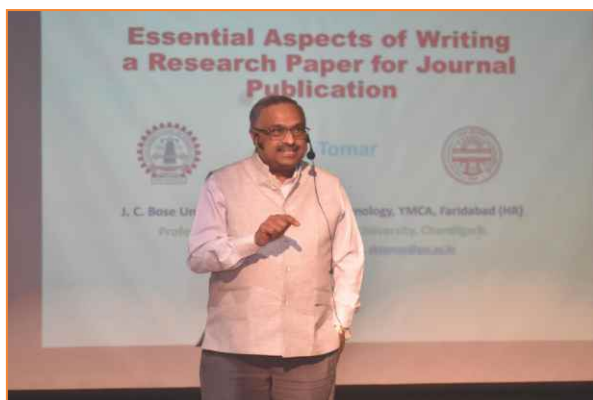
Under the R&D Cell, the University offers Ph.D. programs in various disciplines. The University has adopted the UGC guidelines, allowing candidates to seek admission to Ph.D. programs after completing a 4-year/8-semester Bachelor's degree with Research and having a minimum CGPA of 7.5/10 from the session 2024-2025 through its entrance test. However, the applicants who have qualified and valid GATE/UGC/NET/CSIR (JRF)/SLET/ passed regular M.Phil Programme in the related discipline are exempted from entrance.

The following scholarship schemes are available for research:

- (a) University Research scholarship (URS) of Rs. 25,000/- per month.
- (b) Fellowship/scholarship from outside organizations such as CSIR, UGC, DST, AICTE, etc.
- (c) Fellowships available from IOCL and MOB Alumni Association.

In its short span of two years from inception, the R&D cell achieved the following milestones:

- Initiated a total of 30 research collaborations with industry/institutions of international and national repute.
- Secured sanction for more than 21 research proposals from various funding agencies.
- More than 150 students qualify in various national-level competitive exams such as GATE, CAT, NET, etc., with commendable scores.

ELEMENTS CULMYCA

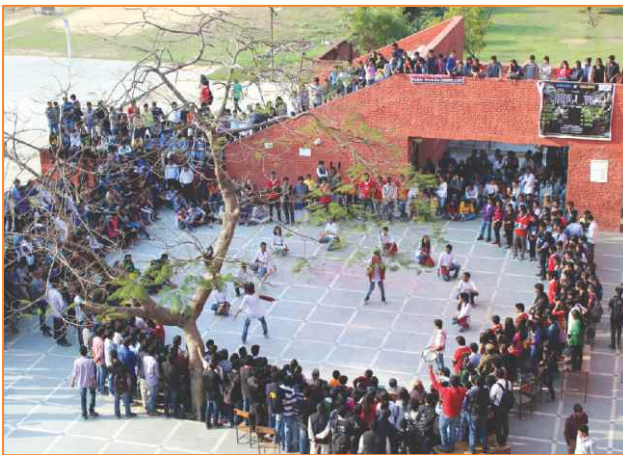

STUDENT'S LIFE AT UNIVERSITY



When you step onto campus, you are immersed in historic red-brick buildings and glorious green spaces. You will find the campus both a peaceful and vibrant place to spend your time. The office of the Dean of Students Welfare looks after the welfare of the students with active support from representatives of the students, faculty and administration. It closely works with students across all years to provide leadership, social, extracurricular and academic counseling programmes. There is a Students' Council and Student Welfare Committee which caters to the students' interests and promotes cultural and sports activities. The elections to the Students' Council are conducted under the supervision of DSW office.



CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Promoting academic excellence is not the only aim of the University. The University provides a vibrant platform through the wide variety of forums and clubs that promotes. Sports, cultural, social service and other extra-curricular and co-curricular activities which not only nurture talent but also develop team building, leadership and organisational skills. Besides various social and cultural clubs, the University has formed different groups like Youth Red Cross, National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps (Naval wing and Army Wing), Vivekanand Manch and Ethiccraft Club to develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, and the ideals of selfless services among the youth to make them useful citizens. Through these groups, the University has a broad mission to develop the "whole student" and involvement of students in such activities is a key tool in their personal development.



SPORTS ACTIVITIES



Sports play a pivotal role in shaping student's personality and maintaining good health. It also builds many skills in a student like teamwork, leadership and self-confidence. In the University, sports activities go simultaneously with the academic session with active participation of students. The students not only actively participate in inter-college and inter-university sports competitions but also perform well and bring laurels to the University. The University has indoor facility for sports like Table Tennis, Badminton, Yoga, Kabaddi, Weightlifting, Boxing, Chess and Carrom, and outdoor facilities for Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Archery and Athletic events.

COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITIES

The University conducts community development programmes such as 'Blood donation camps', 'Tree plantation', 'Cleanliness campaign', 'Health checkups camps' and 'Joy of giving' regularly. It has adopted five villages namely Alipur Sikargah, Sehrawak, Tillori Khaddar, Rajpur and Tejpur Kalan in District Faridabad under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Also, the University has adopted 'Aanchal Chhaya' orphanage, located in Baghola, district Palwal. Apart from academic activities, the University encouraged students to contribute towards society upliftment. A group of students impart free education to those children who are deprived of education by arranging evening classes within the campus.



CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE

BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN INDUSTRY AND ACADEMIA

The University has setup Centres of Excellence (CoE) in collaboration with DANFOSS under the theme 'Climate and Energy', Daikin Airconditioning India Pvt. Ltd. on HVAC systems and Godrej and Boyce Manufacturing Company Limited to initiate vocational training activities. The University has also set-up Industry Training Centres in collaboration with Royal Enfield and Bosch India.

These Centres will enable the University to bridge the gap between industry and academia by incorporating global industrial practices and technologies into the academic curriculum and also improve employability and self competency in the students.



AUDITORIUM



The University has constructed an auditorium in 2017 to promote the conduct of International, National and State University events such as conferences, workshops, seminars, meetings, placement programmes and cultural events. The Auditorium was inaugurated by Chief Minister Sh. Manohar Lal on October 26, 2017. The auditorium is well-furnished, air-conditioned and equipped with modern projection and audio systems with access to the internet. The auditorium features fixed traditional theatre style seating with a capacity of more than 200 persons, raised stage, adjustable lighting, sound system, large screen for video and computer presentations. The auditorium is designed in such a way that they ensure a perfect view of the main stage irrespective of the seating location of the audience.

SHAKUNTALAM MULTIPURPOSE HALL

One of the biggest attractions of the University is Shakuntalam–A multipurpose hall, located in the heart of the University which is designed in adherence to the ultra-modern and eco-friendly specifications. It is extensively utilized as an integral domain of the University and an architecturally beautiful structure on the campus. This huge space has been in use for both sports events as well as for non-sports activities. It provides a well-equipped space suitable for a wide range of activities such as cultural fest, yoga, workshops, exhibitions and poster making sessions. The Multipurpose Hall is also equipped with HVLS fan which keeps the space cool and comfortable.



FACILITIES

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The University Health Centre, located within the campus, at a close distance from the academic and hostel blocks. It has been upgraded in the year 2017 into a fully air-conditioned Health Centre having one regular and one part time doctor, nurse, pharmacist, clerk/typist, dispensary attendant and a helper attendant. It was inaugurated by social reformer Sh. Indresh Kumar on July 16, 2017.

The Health Centre caters to the needs of all the students and staff, including regular check up and medicines for common ailments. The Health Centre also conducts various investigations such as CBC, MP by Card Method, Typhi Dot, LFT, KFT, LIPID Profile, Blood Group, Widal and ECG.



MAHARISHI NARAD - CENTRE FOR MEDIA RESEARCH AND PRODUCTION

To cater the learning needs of students of media studies, the University has an advanced Digital Studio in the newly constructed Science Block. The Studio not only provides practical training and exposure to the students but is also an added facility to produce in-house online lectures of the University, besides fetching the consultancy projects in relevant area.

SARASWATI E-CONTENT DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The Saraswati e-Content Development Centre, a cutting-edge facility established by the University, aims to elevate e-content creation among faculty members. This dedicated Lecture Capturing Facility (LCF) empowers educators to produce top-tier recordings of lectures, accommodating diverse learning preferences and styles, from audio-based captures to comprehensive video presentations. The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sushil Kumar Tomar, officially inaugurated the facility on March 18, 2024, in the esteemed presence of Prof. Bhagwan Singh, former Registrar of Chaudhary Bansi Lal University, marking a pivotal moment in the University's commitment to advancing educational resources.



STUDENT ACTIVITY CENTRE (SHRI KRISHNA BHAWAN)



Shri Krishna Bhawan (Student Activity Centre) Shri Krishna Bhawan is a building with centralized student-centric activities and facilities. The building, which is named after Lord Shri Krishna, encompasses a cafeteria and mess facilities for students, along with spaces designated for student activities under the office of Dean Student Welfare through various student clubs. Serving as a centralized hub, Shri Krishna Bhawan facilitates student registration, scholarships, and various welfare programs under the Academics Section and its Registration and Scholarship Branch, ensuring seamless accessibility and convenience for all university students.



COMMON FACILITIES

The University prioritizes the well-being of both residential and non-residential students, as well as faculty members, by offering a plethora of amenities to enrich their lives. Among these, the Vita Milk Booth and Mother Dairy ensure that students receive nutritious and delicious dairy products conveniently within the campus, promoting their health and vitality. Moreover, with the presence of the Indian Overseas Bank, Indian Post Office, Stationery Shop, and ATMs on its campus, the University endeavours to provide comprehensive support services, fostering a conducive environment for learning and growth.



TOWARDS NEP-2020

J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad has taken several initiatives for the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020. These initiatives include:

- The implementation of the Choice Based Credit System in all UG and PG programs since 2016.
- Encouraging students to enroll/register themselves on the Academic Bank of Credit Portal, with a significant number of students already registered.
- Establishing four Centers of Excellence and a Technology Business Incubator to provide a supportive platform for students to realize their start-up dreams. The University is also considering establishing new Centers of Excellence on Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, and on Bioprospecting and Bioprocessing.
- Inculcating ethical values among students through courses on Bhadwad Gita, Swami Vivekananda's Thoughts, The Constitution of India, Human Ethics and Professional Values, Yoga, and Naturopathy. The University also organizes events to enhance problem-solving skills and creative thinking amongst students.
- Integrating vocational programs into mainstream education with various vocational courses under the Community College of Skill Development.
- Preparing a scheme of various disciplines incorporating a Multiple Entry-Exit system at the University level, where it is compulsory for students to choose at least one vocational subject. The University is also exploring the possibilities of bringing flexibility in Master's programs, including 1 Year programs - for those who have completed the 4-year Bachelor's degree; 2-year programs for those who have completed the 3-year Bachelor's degree, and Integrated 5-year Bachelor's/Master's programs.
- Offering courses of Multidisciplinary education under the Faculty of Interdisciplinary Studies and Research and other faculties.
- Preparing a draft of Institutional Development Plan to enhance development in all directions, such as the development of a new campus, concept of Open Library, Centre(s) of Excellences, 24-Hours Reading Hall, MoUs with nearby reputed research institutes such as "IOCL, RCB, NCCB" etc. The University is inclined more towards research and is emerging as a "Research-Intensive University."
- Conducting syllabus workshops, modifying curriculums as per the latest technology in emerging areas, following AICTE guidelines in each and every Engineering, Management program, Sciences & Humanity offering Ph.D. programs in most relevant fields, conducting skill-based training, industrial/research laboratories visits, expert lectures on emerging areas, and teaching environmental education in every program.
- Establishing a "University Computer Centre & Digital Affairs Cell" responsible for establishing IT infrastructure and carrying out the digitization of all processes in the University. The University has developed/deployed various software, including Digital Learning Management System (DLMS), ERP Portal, Faculty Information Management System (FIMS), Feedback System, COVID-Helpdesk, Admission portal, and University Website, etc.
- Broadening the education frontiers for international students in all university courses, including science and journalism, and offering 15% supplementary seats under the foreign category in the field of Computer Engineering, and 5% seats are reserved for international students in all courses offered by the Faculty of Sciences and Faculty of Management Studies.
- Establishing sustainable partnerships with various internationally prestigious Universities and having faculty members of different departments as members of diverse International professional societies (IEEE/IET/IAENG, etc.) to enhance student and faculty experience at the international level.

EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING OFFICE

The University Employment and Training Office (ETO) works with the vision to collaborate with the best of the industries and right business organizations within and outside the campus to provide the right launchpad to our students. In order to sharpen the skillset of our students so that they are prepared to face the fierce competition in the market. 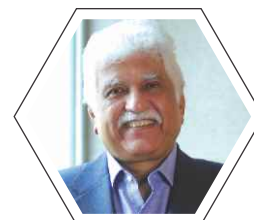

Subject: Regarding issuing Income Certificates through SARAL portal.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your attention to provisions of the *Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021 (20 of 2021)* which provides for the assignment of the Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a unique identifier number to each family. The database namely Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) contains PPN alongwith corresponding information generally required for determining eligibility for, or the provision of any scheme, service, subsidy or benefit provided/implemented by or on behalf of the State Government/any Government agency/local authority. State Government has been empowered under Section 8 of the Act to prescribe Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a requirement for the purpose of determining above mentioned eligibility or provision. The verified information linked with PPN available in Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) has now made it feasible to issue Income Certificates across the counter through SARAL portal.

3. Keeping in view the above, Government has decided to issue instructions regarding issuance of Income Certificates, in suppression of previous instructions, if any, as under:-

(i) Portal for issuance of Income Certificate.—

Income Certificate shall be issued to eligible residents of Haryana on provision of PPN through the SARAL portal (<https://saralharyana.gov.in/>) facsimile signed by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner cum District Citizen Resources Information Officer).

These certificates will be issued on the basis of verified data on income contained in FIDR.

(ii) Person who is entitled to obtain Income Certificate.—

A person who is a resident of State of Haryana shall be entitled to obtain Income Certificate on provision of PPN and having income verified in FIDR.

(iii) Verification of Income.—

The income shall be verified on the basis of the verified data contained in the Family Information Data Repository (FIDR) in accordance with the provisions of the Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021 and notifications issued thereunder.

(iv) **Competent Authorities for issuance of Income Certificate.—**

Income certificates shall be issued on provision of PPN through SARAL portal (<https://saralharyana.gov.in/>) to eligible residents of Haryana by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner -cum- District Citizen Resources Information Officer) under his jurisdiction through his facsimile signature on the certificate.

(v) **Online Service for verification of income based on PPN.—**

Residents seeking to get their income verified in FIDR may visit '<https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance>' portal. Once the request for verification of income is made by the resident on this portal, designated LC will verify and mark the same as verified in the FIDR for the resident.

(vi) **Validity of an Income Certificate.—**

- (i) An Income Certificate once issued (in its standard format) shall be valid for the current financial year, i.e till coming 31st March (included) from the date of issuance of the certificate.
- (ii) An Income Certificate may become invalid at any time during the financial year, if after due process, it has been concluded that the income was incorrectly mentioned on the certificate or wrongly verified in the FIDR, due to any reason whatsoever.

(vii) **Grievance Redressal and Correction Process.—**

If an applicant is not in agreement with his income contained in the FIDR, then he/she may lodge his/her grievance for re-verification on the Grievance Module of the PPN portal (<https://meraparivar.haryana.gov.in/ReportGrievance>). The grievances will be dealt with as per the mechanism separately notified by Haryana Parivar Pehchan Authority under the provisions of the Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021.


(viii) **General Terms and Conditions.—**

- (a) The Income Certificate is usable without any restriction wherever it is accepted (i.e., subject to the criteria laid down by the entity accepting the certificate) and hence no usage/applicability restrictions shall be mentioned on the certificate.
- (b) From the effective date of this order, only the Income Certificates issued through SARAL portal in the format prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information Department, based on PPN and corresponding verified data contained in the FIDR shall be valid Income Certificates.
- (c) An Income Certificate obtained by means of any fraud, misrepresentation or concealment of facts or by any other illegal means shall be declared as invalid and the benefit availed by the candidate/applicant shall be withdrawn and legal action including criminal proceedings will be initiated against the applicant for misrepresenting the facts and playing fraud, as well as against the officials/authorized persons for incorrect/ wrong verification by collusion or otherwise. In such an event, the income shall

be marked as NOT VERIFIED in the FIDR.

- (d) Mere issuance of an Income Certificate does not entitle a person holding such certificate to any benefit that may be admissible under various Government schemes implemented from time to time. Hence, it is important that the authority concerned examines the applicant's entitlement to any specific benefit in accordance with the instructions on the subject at any given point of time. Other eligibility criteria for a particular scheme shall be addressed separately by the authority extending such benefit.
- (e) All Haryana Government organisations (including Departments, Educational Institutions, Boards, Corporations and Societies) are required to accept the Income Certificate in its standard format prescribed by the Citizen Resources Information Department from time to time.
- (f) Any Government organisation accepting physical copy of the income Certificate for the purpose of any scheme, benefit etc. may check the real-time status of the verified income of the person to whom the certificate pertains, on the PPP portal.
4. No Government Department of Haryana shall obligate any resident of the State to submit income related proof documents if he/she provides PPN and his/her income is marked as verified in Family Information Data Repository (FIDR).
5. The above instructions/guidelines may kindly be brought to the notice of all the concerned for strict compliance.



In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

***Section 3. (1)** Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.*


***(2)** Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.*

Section 6.** A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under **sub-section (2) of section 5.

2. In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorities competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions may find out easily as to how many candidates applied

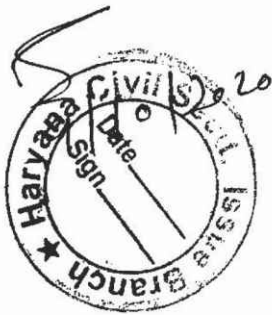
for admission and how many have been given admission under 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' category.

POLICY FOR PROVIDING SUPPORT BY THE UNIVERSITY TO PURSUE HIGHER EDUCATION TO THE ABANDONED, SURRENDERED AND ORPHAN CHILDREN.

Objective:

The aim of this Policy is to provide support by the University to pursue Higher Education including Technical Education, Skill Development to the Abandoned, Surrendered and Orphan Children.

Definitions under the Policy:

- 1. Abandoned:** Abandoned under this Policy means a child found abandoned whose parents, guardians, relatives could not be traced despite making due inquiry and admitted to the Child Care Institution before the age of 5 years and declared abandoned by the Child Welfare Committee (as per Juvenile Justice Act, 2000/2015) or as per the rules prevailing at the time and has completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institutions.
- 2. Surrendered Child:** Surrendered child under this policy means a child who is relinquished by the parents or guardian, on account of physical, emotional and social factors beyond their control and admitted to the Child care Institution before the age of 01 years and declared as surrendered by the Child Welfare Committee after due inquiry (as per Juvenile Justice Act, 2000/2015) or as per the rules prevailing at that time and has completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institutions.
- 3. Orphan Child:** Orphan child under this policy means a child, who have lost their parents (both father & mother) and is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian or whose legal guardian is not willing to take or capable of taking care of the child (as per section 2 (42) of JJ Act, 2015) and having the family income (including guardian, if any) less than Rs.2.00 Lakh Per Annum from all sources.

Eligibility & Benefits under the Policy

1. One seat in all UG/PG/ other programme of UTD of this University will be reserve for Abandoned / Surrender / Orphan Children.
2. The programmes which required AICTE Approval, the seat will be filled under EWS Category and if same is lying vacant or no application has been received, then seat will be merged in EWS Category. For other programmes except AICTE approved, one seat reserved as supernumerary seat and if remain vacant will not be filled / merged in any other category, as per the provisions of HSTES.
3. The student covered under this policy will be provided 100% free education (all fees including hostel charges) after verifying all the document as per the guidelines of policy. The applicants, who have applied for admission under these categories, may bear application form charges, which will be reimbursable after verification.
4. Criteria for admissions under this policy:-
 - a. Abandoned and Surrendered Children upto to the age of 25 years who were admitted to the Child Care Institutions before the age of 05 year (as Abandoned) and before the age of 01 year (as Surrendered) and have completed the age of 18 years while living in Child Care Institution
 - b. Orphan Children, who have lost their parents (both father & mother) and is without biological or adoptive parents or legal guardian or whose legal guardian is not willing to take or capable of taking care of the child and having the family income (including guardian, if any) less than Rs.2.00 Lakh Per Annum from all sources.

Both (a) and (b) will be provided Free Higher Education including Technical Education alongwith hostel facilities in the University. However, minimum eligibility criteria of respective courses as per University Information Brochure notified time to time, must be fulfilled by the applicants.

5. The applicant must produce a certificate issued by the Competent Authority/ Body i.e. Concerned District Programme Officer.
6. The admissions shall be made under this policy purely on merit basis.
7. This policy is only for Haryana Residents applicants.
8. The expenditure incurred for admission and continuance of study of such students including hostel expenditure in the University will be met from the Dean Student Welfare fund or some outside NGO/Agencies.

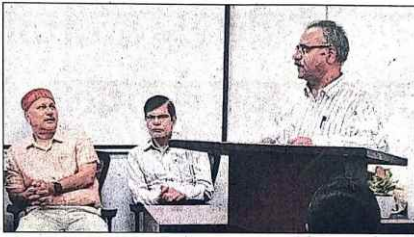

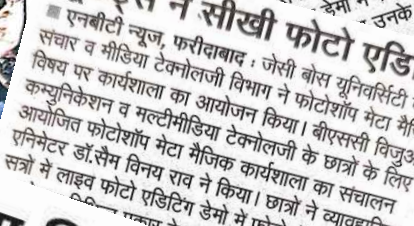

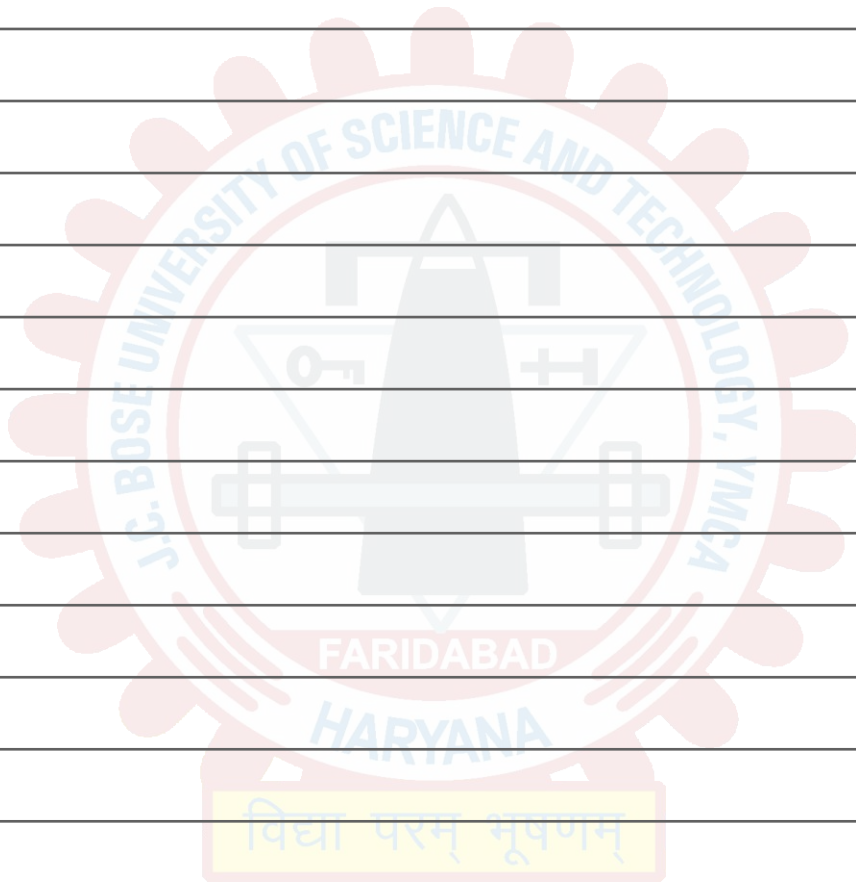
